Minutes of Meeting, 3 September 2014

The meeting was held at and hosted by Club Auto, 11100 W. 8th Ave., Lakewood CO. Prior to the meeting club representatives were invited to tour the vintage vehicles on display and there were pizza and soft drinks provided by Hagerty Insurance. Guest speakers included Michael Hesse of the Denver Police Museum, Rick Eagen describing the Club Auto facility, Derek Prechtl and Sarah Bain of Hagerty Insurance, and Rob Endter of Rocky Mountain Car Club.

The business meeting was called to order at 7:27 pm. Officers present were Dick Thompson, president; Gary Canady, 1st vice president; Dick Fritz, secretary; and Tom Kay, treasurer. 35 member clubs and one associate member were represented. Guests and new representatives were introduced.

Leo Boyle noted that the Colorado legislature is not in session and there have been no hints of legislation that might affect car hobbyists. Most legislators are involved with pre election campaigning. CCCC is non-political but can recognize legislators, regardless of party, who have helped with car hobbyist issues that have come up. Two such individuals are Max Tyler and Dianne Primavera.

Minutes of the July 2nd meeting were approved as published.

7 additional clubs have renewed bringing the total membership to 59 clubs. The treasurer's report was approved.

Bylaws revision and amendments: Dick Thompson discussed revisions to the bylaws and how current practice has changed. Copies of the current bylaws were available: they can be found on the website, or they can be sent upon request to the secretary. It was moved (Bill Hunter) and seconded (Samantha Baker) that the proposed changes be published with the minutes of this meeting. The motion passed unanimously. The proposed changes are presented in an addendum to these minutes and will be discussed at the next meeting.

Future CCCC Swap Meets: We have an opportunity to work with the Denver Police Museum on community events that support the museum with their "First Responders Tribute" events centered on weekends near September 11th. This year there will be a car show at the Northfield Shopping Center. In the future it may be possible to hold a swap meet in conjunction with a car show at Mile High Stadium in September. The idea is in the early discussion stage.

Tom Kay, Don Leach, and Samantha Baker have volunteered to be on a committee to explore all ideas about revitalizing the CCCC swap meet. More volunteers could always be used. The 2012 and 2013 events at Front Range Airport showed the value of pairing the meet with another event. It was noted that prewar parts are becoming scarce at established swap meets and in the future more emphasis should be put on rusty as well as shiny parts. There was also discussion regarding when in the year a swap meet should be held and if possible it should be included in the NSRA calendar that is compiled in October. Any club that wants to have a 2015 event listed on the NSRA Rod Run calendar should email information to Dick Thompson.

November Rod & Custom Show (Greybeard's): We intend to have a display of 6 cars at the Thanksgiving weekend show held at the Colorado Convention Center in Denver. The vehicles should show the variety of cars owned by CCCC club members.

Web Site: Representatives were urged to check the updated information about clubs on the CCCC web site.

Next Meeting: Wednesday, October 1, 7:30 pm, at the Forney Transportation Museum, 4303 Brighton Blvd., Denver. Nominations for CCCC officers for 2015 will be open. Also there will be discussion about amending the CCCC bylaws.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:20 pm.
